

Wok-tossed Vegetables with Chicken

Season: Autumn/Winter/Spring

Makes: 30 tastes in the classroom or 6 at home

Fresh from the garden: Chinese broccoli, garlic, garlic chives, shallots, spring onions

Equipment:

kitchen knife
chopping board
metric measuring spoons
wok
wok chan

Ingredients:

2 chicken breasts, finely sliced
1 tbsp sunflower oil
4 cloves garlic, finely chopped
2 red Asian shallots, finely chopped
2 bunches of Chinese broccoli, chopped into 3 cm pieces
500 g bean sprouts, washed
large handful garlic chives, cut into 5 cm lengths
6 spring onions, cut into 5 cm lengths
2 tsp fish sauce
1 tsp sugar
2 tsp sesame oil
1 tsp freshly ground pepper
salt to taste

What to do:

1. Prepare ingredients based on the instructions in the ingredients list.
2. Heat half the sunflower oil in the wok.
3. Add finely-sliced chicken and stir-fry for 3-5 minutes.
4. Remove chicken from wok and place in a bowl until needed.
5. Heat remaining oil in the wok.
6. Add garlic and shallots and stir-fry for 10 seconds.
7. Toss in Chinese broccoli, garlic chives and spring onions and stir-fry for 1 minute.
8. Add fish sauce, sugar, 1 tbsp of water and a pinch of salt. Grind over fresh black pepper.
9. Add cooked chicken and bean sprouts to the wok.
10. Stir-fry for another minute, then finish with a drizzle of sesame oil.
11. Serve with jasmine rice.


