National Reconciliation Week

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. The dates for NRW remain the same each year; 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey—the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

The 2020 theme for National Reconciliation Week is 'In This Together'. This theme reminds us that reconciliation is a journey for all Australians, as individuals, families, communities, organisations and importantly, as a nation. At the heart of this journey are relationships between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, and how they can foster a positive sense of 'coming together' now and into the future.

Bairnsdale West Primary School hold an assembly each year during Reconciliation Week. This year the assembly will be broadcast online and will highlight the ongoing, continuous journey and commitment of BWPS to Reconciliation. Presenters will draw attention and reflect on the events leading up to the 1967 Referendum, the importance of the 1992 Mabo High Court Decision and the local Koorie community's long fought battle for the Gunaikurnai's recognition and attainment of Native Title, 10 years ago in October this year. This year guest speakers include Dr. Doris Paton, Grattan Mullet, staff and students and the BWPS choir who will this year incorporate a verse in Gunaikurnai language.
