Francis class have been finishing off their "I see you, You see me masks". They have been reflecting on their own character strengths, and the character strengths that others identify in them.








Foundation year are working on their painted sticks, getting them ready to glue all sorts of found and glitter objects on to. I think they will look like giant wands when they are finished?


