The group attended a welcome and induction event in Warragul where they were greeted by Mr Paul Velten - Executive Director of Diocese of Sale Catholic Education Limited (DOSCEL) and Associate Professor Damien Lyons - Deputy Chair of Education, Swinburne University of Technology.

The three-year Accelerated Bachelor of Education (Primary) program is a DOSCEL sponsored study initiative.

The partnership between DOSCEL and Swinburne University of Technology aims to address the pressing issue of teacher shortages by tailoring a teacher education program specifically for current Education Support staff working in Catholic schools within our Diocese.

SPECIAL REPORT: Embracing Change & New Beginnings



Periods of change are an inevitable part of growing up. Whether it's the start of a new school year, moving between year levels, or stepping beyond the school gates for the final time, each transition presents both opportunities and challenges. These moments often require young people to use and strengthen the skills needed to manage un-

certainty, adjust to new environments and build resilience. While some may embrace change with enthusiasm, others can find it unsettling and disruptive to their sense of routine and security.

Research consistently shows that transitions can be stress points, often linked to heightened anxiety, reduced academic engagement and changes in peer connections. For families, these times can also place additional pressure on communication, expectations and emotional regulation. Understanding the psychological and emotional impact of change allows parents, caregivers and educators to better support young people as they adjust.

The ability to manage change is closely tied to resilience. Developing this capacity doesn't happen overnight; it is built over time through consistent guidance, clear boundaries and access to supportive adults. When we work together to create a shared understanding of how to support transitions, students are more likely to feel confident, connected and capable.

Change can be challenging, but it also offers valuable opportunities for growth. By normalising these experiences and keeping the lines of communication open, young people can feel more secure during times of transition. When schools and families work together to provide encouragement, reassurance and structure, it creates a strong foundation that helps students not only adapt to new beginnings but approach them with confidence and curiosity.

SPECIAL REPORT: New Social Media Regulations

From 10 December 2025, age-restricted social media platforms will have to take reasonable steps to prevent Australians under the age of 16 from creating or keeping an account. This landmark reform marks a major step forward in addressing growing concerns about the impact of social media on children's mental health and development.

These changes aim to create a safer, more balanced digital environment by shifting responsibility back onto social media platforms to verify user ages and reduce exposure to harmful content. For many families, this is a welcome and long-awaited move that recognises mounting evidence linking early social media use with anxiety, poor sleep, body image concerns and reduced wellbeing.

While regulation is an important milestone, it cannot replace parental guidance. Families continue to play a vital role in helping children navigate the online world with awareness and confidence. This is an opportunity to review technology use at home, set healthy boundaries and start open conversations about digital behaviour. By understanding what these new regulations mean and why they matter, parents and caregivers can feel empowered to support their children's online safety and wellbeing through this period of change.

To stay informed about how these laws will work in practice, visit the <u>eSafety Commissioner</u> website for updates, tools and guidance.
